### **Teator Family History**

I started gathering information about the Teator/Teter/Tator/Dater families in 1985, after falling for one of my mother's dares. I was busy for three years, gathering files and files of material.

The next twenty-five years saw a much reduced rate of progress. Now, thirty years of accumulation fill about a dozen shelf feet, with info about our Reunion, direct lines going back to 1710, related families, waiting-to-be-connected families, ethnic history, etc.

I had high hopes that I would gather the information and produce a book that would serve as a document for years to come.

I have finally admitted defeat. The task is bigger than I can handle at this point in my life and have settled for Plan B, albeit a very good, and perhaps a better, plan.

I have hired local genealogist-local historian Sylvia Hasenkopf to produce a document that traces our family history since 1710 when our ancestors came with the Palatine immigration. Although she and I have yet to finalize the details about the final product, it should be possible to make multiple copies for those interested.
