Bryer, Bernard Keith WEST MELBOURNE, Fla. Bernard Keith Bryer, 89, of West Melbourne, passed away on December 2, 2016, at Vitas Hospice in Merritt Island, Fla. "Bud" was a veteran, serving in the Army Air Force during World War II. He served in Guam and Manila. After the service, Bud started and operated Apex Printing for many years. He was active as a musician and played the saxophone with the Yankee Doodle Band and his own band, the Bud Bryer Big Band. He leaves behind his loving wife, Alfreda; a son, Ronald Bryer, New Jersey; and a daughter, Eileen Carey of Florida. His ashes will be interred in the Gerald B.H.
