Arrive around noon, or whenever you can.


- Food will be served probably about one o'clock, shortly thereafter.

The hobby of family history can be just a collection of information of dates and names. Usually, however, it is difficult to stop there, if one is really interested in family background. Stories are told and passed down, photos are shown to preserve or make memories, and artifacts are kept in someone's possession.

One of these venerable artifacts, perhaps the most important one for the Teter Reunion, is a cut-out board holding the swords and stirrups used by John Teter. Yes, our John Teter!

The metal plaque is inscribed: CAPTAIN JOHN TEATER 1835 TO 1850

A gummed label was attached (and now kept separately) and had text on it:

Sword used by Captain John Teater in training, Grandfather of N. Radick.

The swords and stirrups are said to have been used when John Teter trained with the local militia on the Middleburgh Flats in the years indicated above. Details about which militia company remains unknown to me; a great find would be to locate that information. What that training consisted of also remains unknown, to

me, at least. If anyone wants to investigate further, you would have the Teter Reunion on the edge of our seats!

So, how do these swords and stirrups come into my possession? Norm Radick, grandson of John, had possession of these in the early history. It then passed on to Norman Teator, who held them for many years. Upon his passing, they went to Janet Armstrong who passed them on to me.

Those named above have acted as the guardians and holders of this artifact. We don't own it. I trust that this handing down of John's swords will continue for many years and generations. I will bring this artifact to the next reunion.

A couple other notes:

—As always, come prepared for what Mother Nature throws our way.
