Share Session

Len shared, and contributed, a map that Claribel Gardiner and Edna Adams had sketched in 1976, a condensed version of which is enclosed in this newsletter, along with the 174 families/structures identified. Although this map seems like yesterday for some of us, it truly is one of those handmade local history treasures.

Harriett brought in an account she had shared a few years ago, an account of D. B. Abrams and the story of the submarine Cisco in World War Two. A re-reading felt as fresh as we had first heard it.

Mimi brought in a couple of Civil War documents of local men getting a "deferment" from serving in the war. I'll include copies of those in the next newsletter

Don had a bunch of stuff. We looked over the Greene County Historical Society's Home Tour brochure and several of us had taken in the tour that day, so we commented on what we liked. Also shown was the new book on the Susquehanna Turnpike.

The bulk of the evening was a sharing of the annual scrapbooks that Margaret Bogardus compiled from the 1950s onward, along with a couple of books that took in 1930-1950 and before. Any time you show scrapbooks of newspaper clippings and notices to the GLHG, the evening will be consumed, and thus this evening was too. Many stories and memories relating to some part of some scrapbook flew back and forth across the table until closing time. Remember page two from the last newsletter? What is the importance of this sheet that had all that old looking handwriting? First, it is a copy of town minutes from 1808-1809! Secondly, you should have noticed all three names for our town – Greenfield (dated April 28, 1808), and the notice that showed that the name of the town was changing from Freehold to Greenville! This minutes book is among the very oldest of original records relating to our town. For those of you who recognized, good for you.
